"In you our ancestors trusted; they trusted, and you delivered them." Psalm 22:4 NRSV

The last couple of years have included a deep reflection on the history of my home church, Messiah in Minneapolis, along with my ancestors that were part of Messiah while still here on earth. As I recently perused a family tree, (a tree which is getting quite thin), I was invigorated by the significant impact those before me had made for their churches and far reaching communities. Just today, as part of a search of my past from my father's side of the family; I found that Bethel Lutheran Church in Northfield, MN had my Grandfather, Ole Shirley, listed as the first signer of the church's constitution drafted and adopted by seven gentlemen and their families, for which they are considered the Charter Members of the 110 year old church (with the roots of the church going back decades prior).

Messiah Lutheran (as a Charter Member of Luther Park) has completed a lengthy final transition from its former historic church building with the sale of the building. Messiah's Congregation recently voted to tithe with the proceeds from the historic building sale and Luther Park received a portion of that forward thinking generosity. At its October 25, 2018 meeting, the Luther Park Board of Directors voted to keep moving forward with renovating three remaining cabins at a rate of at least one cabin per year. Messiah's recent gift is earmarked by the Board to provide the materials for the renovation of one cabin in 2019. Although Phase One of the Bethel Family & Adult Retreat Center is nearly complete, it has taken considerable energy and the Board felt we need to make sure the other facilities receive proper attention. We are certainly placing our trust in the friends of Luther Park to keep the cabin renovation and new facility initiatives moving forward, along with promoting and expanding the use of Your Outdoor Ministry. Striding into the next 60!

As this will be the final A Message From The President column during my soon to be term limited tenure on the Board; it is a deep personal joy and satisfaction to see the Retreat Center take shape and the Board in good hands. To stay true to my love of Luther Park's Christ based ministry; I plan to remain on the Finance and Development Committees, coordinate the June Bikeathon event, along with other outreach efforts, as my faith and volunteerism roots are deep at Luther Park. We celebrated Luther Park's 60th year at the Summer Open House on July 14th and the energy for Luther Park is ever growing. Please keep Luther Park in your prayers, legacy planning, along with projects of special interest (perhaps join the Development Committee?).

Thank you for the continued support of Luther Park's ministry, while helping to sustain and grow its long reaching roots.




Your Backpack Belongs



Kurtis Hemphill, from Antrim, Northern Ireland, was a international counselor at Luther Park between 2016-2018. Here are his reflections about summer camp.



Hello, I'm Kurtis Hemphill and I spent the summers of 2016-2018 working at Luther Park. I have thoroughly enjoyed my time working at camp and I'm so glad to have both witnessed and been a part of the ministry that is taking place there. By bringing campers closer to the Lord, this ministry has not only enhanced the lives of thousands of campers over Luther Park's six decades but it has also strengthened my own faith. Children are wonderfully curious people and I believe we can learn an awful lot from them; I remember Jesus' words to His disciples, "Truly I tell you, unless you change and

become like little children, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven." Personally, it had never occurred to me to question why Levites and Samaritans didn't have particularly cordial relations with one another however the inquisitive mind of a camper led to me gaining a deeper knowledge of a story I'd heard many times before. Furthermore, children's attitudes towards each other can be very intriguing. I've witnessed groups rally to comfort a friend in distress, the excite-



ment on a campers face when their best friend arrives as well as the disappointment over having to leave on the last day. By openly expressing what they feel, they reveal their true selves with each character being distinctive and special just as God designed them. Therefore, these are the reasons why I love Luther Park as it offers all of us



involved the opportunity to grow with each other because the staff learn just as much from the campers as they do from us. There is of course a dash of fun and games thrown into this mixture as well, after all camp isn't just school for summer! Camp, to me, is an entertaining and caring community which seeks to glorify God and enjoy God's creation.


