UTHER PARK REMEMBERED

by Diane Anderson Chambers – a former counselor and camper from Luther Park. Her family also was a part of Luther Park's beginnings years ago.

"We welcome you to Luther Park. We're mighty glad you're here...."

For two summers in the early 1970s, I and the other staff welcomed campers as the bus pulled into Luther Park. Each week we shared the Gospel through songs, skits, campfires, devotions, games, and fellowship. I became part of a close-knit staff that worked together creating community for the campers and ourselves. I read somewhere that Bible camp is one of the most important places for spiritual development among young people - and I think it applied to both the staff and the

kids who showed up. It was a grand time for seeing God all around us and sharing the love of Jesus.

But my experience with Luther Park did not begin with my counselor years. It began with the founding of Luther Park. Bethel Lutheran, the church my family attended then, came in at the start. My parents and their friends spent many weekends there, even before the cabins were built. The most memorable time was the night we slept in the boathouse. Yes, the boathouse where bunk beds lined the walls. Mostly I remember the cold seeping in as we tried to sleep.

My times at Luther Park solidified in me my love of nature and the wonder of creation. I remember clearly the first time I stood in the field and

looked up at the stars. This kid had never seen so many stars. It became a regular habit to look up and wonder—a habit I have not given up.

A few years ago I visited again with a group from Elim Lutheran. We stayed in the tree houses and enjoyed both fellowship with one another and the woods and lake around us. Of course, my sister and I reminisced about the boat house night, but we also breathed in God's grandeur. Luther Park is most likely the reason "How Great Thou Art" is one of my favorite hymns. 🚣



The campers are eager to tell me how excited they are for this summer. And their parents are excited to share how their child has been positively influenced because of their camp experience. A recent study done with 6 different ELCA camps in Wisconsin showed that two months after camp, campers indicated increased self-confidence, devotional practices, church attendance, faith conversations and practices in the home and more understanding of how God is relevant in their daily life (Sorenson,

2017). Camp is shaping these little humans to enter into a world where they can be more confident with the person God created them to be. Because of camp, they can continue to explore how this is God's world, how we belong to God's people and that we are all loved very much by a wonderful, forgiving and grace filled God. 

Treasurer Deana presented Financial Statements. She commented that income for 2017 was good and had a substantial increase over 2016, due to a couple one-time gifts. The year end report was approved. Discussion followed that there could be additional income generated, once the Retreat Center is opened in Sept. Given the quality of the rooms, adults may book it for adult retreats. The 2018 Budget was presented by Deana and was approved by all.

BOARD MEMBERS

Vice President Candace thanked the outgoing Board Members and presented the new candidates for the openings created by the retiring Board Members. Lisa Turnquist is taking over for Rachel Meinert from St. Barnabas, Randy Johnson is taking over for Darrell Hyde from House of Prayer, Nancy Johnson is taking over for Jenny Parker from Gustavus Adolphus and Scott Housman is taking over for Lori Wright from Mount Calvary.

REPORTS

There was discussion of the Reports and Graphs. Joel commented that at the end of 2017 Luther Park is in Trust. Gifts were

way up in 2017. A big gift was used for improvements in the camp.

Leah addressed the group and talked about the upcoming summer. She has 9 staff members already signed up and perhaps a nurse as well. She will need 18 counselors. She spoke about "Support the Staff" which is a program designed to connect the Staff to the congregations. A supporter would receive a bio from a Staff person and the supporter would pray for and communicate with the Staff person. They could meet each



other at the Open House in July. Financial donations could also be made as the Staff people use contributions for growing as a group. The program was started last year and everyone loved it.

Joel gave us a handout on Peer Ministry. Luther Park received a grant in 2016 and the funds were used in full by early 2017 to host Peer Ministry camps and is continuing to host camps on Peer Ministry.

Joel then gave us an update on the Retreat Center. The HVAC system is getting installed currently, as well as electrical and plumbing. He is also working with the state of WI regarding rebates for using LED lights instead of fluorescent lights. He added that the last weekend in April will be a work weekend. The goal is to reroof the last 3 cabins with the donated shingles.

Leah mentioned that gardening is an option as well as working inside the Retreat Center. David talked about the Master Plan and a site map was available for viewing.

NEW BUSINESS

David reminded people about the annual Bikeathons and got the donating started by contributing a \$2,000 check. The Bikeathons have taken on more importance as we no longer have a Quilt Auction. Deana added that a Development Committee is being started and anyone can join it., i.e. non-board members.

A reminder that this is the 60th Anniversary of Luther Park and will be noted at the Open House. There will be a ribbon cutting ceremony and it will be advertised on the website. The theme for camp this summer is "This Changes Everything" and is based on Ephesians 2:8.

There will be an ACA visit this summer (American Camp Association) which has been done every 3 years, but going forward it will be every 5 years.


A group of individuals just completed roofing one of the cabins a few weeks ago. Two more cabins still need new roofs, which hopefully will be done in the fall.

- √ Send the Registration and Health History Form with a \$200 deposit to Luther Park. The deposit is not refundable and non-transferable after May I.
- √ Final payment is due at the camp office two weeks prior to arrival at camp.
- √ Upon receipt of registration materials, confirmation, directions to camp, and notice of balance due along with other important information will be e-mailed to you, unless you direct otherwise.
- √ Registration is on a first-come basis.



The following will not be allowed: racist comments, teasing, fighting, threats, swearing, and any other behavior that is demeaning to another person. We want a positive week for all who attend
- 2. Safety is our number one concern at all times. Obeying all waterfront rules when swimming, boating, canoeing and fishing allows everyone to have fun in the sun. Waterfront activities are available only when waterfront staff is on duty.
- 3. The ropes Challenge Course—no playing, sitting or loitering on or by the stations unless supervised by authorized camp staff.
- 4. Campers may not enter cabins other than their own without prior permission from a Luther Park staff person. Areas that are off-limit to campers: the pole barn, kitchen, Staff residences, Log House.
- 5. Campers must be accompanied by a Luther Park staff person whenever outside of camp property.
- 6. We are pleased to offer an alcohol-free, smoke-free and substance abuse-free environment. Exceptions must be approved by the director
- 7. Luther Park is a weapons-free environment. Campers may not bring any kind of weapon or explosive device, including firecrackers to camp. Use of any object as a weapon to hurt a person, animal or property will not be tolerated.
- 8. Luther Park reserves the right to store camper's personal items that may be inappropriate to their stay, including cell phones. (Please leave cell phones at home as we don't want them to get broken or lost.) Items will be returned for the trip home upon permission of the parent/guardian.
- 9. For your protection, all medications (including aspirin or similar non-prescription medications) must be turned into the camp health supervisor. If you are injured or do not feel well, report at once to your counselor or health supervisor. This is important for your safety and for the good of all campers.
- 10. Every camper is expected to follow the entire camp schedule unless excused by the Program Director
- 11. To assure the safety of each camper and to provide the best week possible, campers are expected to follow all Luther Park rules that are presented to them while at camp.
