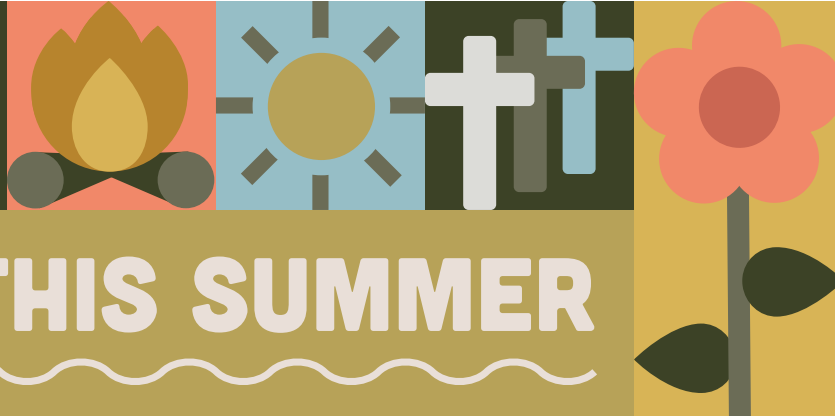

Updates in the Lodge

Luther Park's Lodge has been well used and well loved over its 58 years of existence! It's now time for some updates to restore the Lodge to its former glory and to be more welcoming to those who come to camp. The biggest challenge with the current Lodge is the lack of an ADA-compliant bathroom. Currently, when guests have to use the bathroom, they need to walk down a flight of steps, which is not inviting for our guests who need an accessible and private bathroom.

So, we are doing something about this! We plan to renovate a section of the kitchen office, kitchen bathroom/storage and laundry room to become a public, main-level, ADA-compliant bathroom. In addition, we will be replacing the flooring

throughout the dining hall, and exploring how we can make the kitchen a more functional space for our kitchen staff and groups.

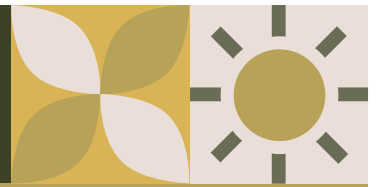

25th Annual LUTHER PARK BIKE-A-THON



Choose your own BIKE-A-THON Adventure



ADVENTURE #1

Bike with Others Locally or On Your Own

Ride with a group or individually in your local community during the weeks of May 20 to June 4. Bikers can ride anywhere they want for as far as they want. Is biking not your thing? Participants can run, walk, hike, rollerblade, swim, etc. Any activity in which you can track miles works for the Bike-a-thon! Luther Park encourages churches or people to gather a team of riders together to either gain miles as a team or be there for each other for moral support. Participants of all ages can participate in this adventure. Minors can participate with a responsible guardian or parent.

ADVENTURE #2

Bike with Others to Luther Park - June 3rd-4th

Ride with a group of other bikers from Messiah Lutheran Church to Luther Park over the course of 2 days, June 3-4. The first day bikers can expect to ride about 75 miles and the second day they will ride about 40 miles. Bikers and Sag Van Drivers stay in a hotel in Luck, WI. Upon arrival to camp, the fabulous Luther Park kitchen staff will have prepared a wonderful buffet lunch. Riders are responsible for their own ride back to the cities but may coordinate to ride home in one of the Sag Vans. Registration for this adventure closes on May 1. 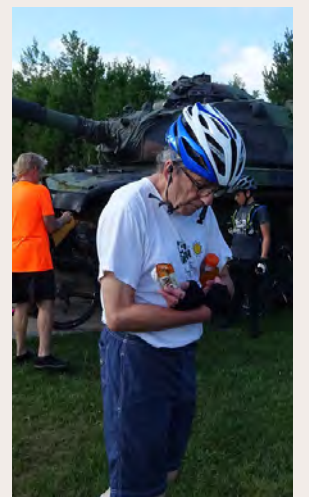
